

## FEES AND ELIGIBILITY

All undergraduate and graduate students who have paid the general University health fees are eligible to use the resources of the Women's Clinic. Spouses of students who have paid an additional spouse fee are also eligible. Each patient is required to show a valid student ID and insurance card at the medical records reception desk before each visit.

There is a fee for some services of the Women's Clinic. Many services are partially or completely covered by insurance, so please bring your insurance information at the time of your appointment.

Any patient who does not show up for a scheduled appointment will be charged a cancellation fee.

## CONFIDENTIALITY



All records of the Women's Clinic are confidential. A record release with the patient's signature is required before any information can be released to anyone, including parents or guardians. All students, even under the age of 18, receive the same confidential care and the cost can be applied to fee bill as miscellaneous charges.

## Additional Information

### DID YOU KNOW???

You may purchase your birth control here at our SHS Pharmacy even if you have not had a physical/pap at the Women's Clinic. If you have had one within the past year with your healthcare provider at home, we will review your records at no charge and provide you with a prescription.

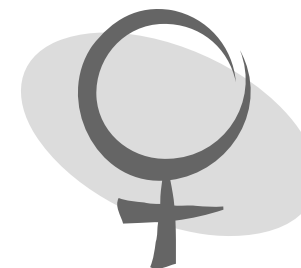

## Our Mission

Routine health care for women is important. The goal of the Women's Clinic is to meet the health needs of female students, regardless of whether they are sexually active or not and regardless of sexual orientation. This goal is met through a comprehensive program of education, physical assessment, treatment and counseling.

The Women's Clinic staff is available by appointment to present programs and talks on women's issues to promote healthy lifestyles for all women.



## WOMEN'S CLINIC STAFF

The services of the Women's Clinic are provided by caring professionals who have undergone special training in women's health care. Registered nurses, female nurse practitioners, and a female physician are available as well as medical and gynecological physician consultants.

## SERVICES

### The Women's Clinic Offers:

- Advice nurse available to answer any questions at **486-0026**.
- Confidential HIV counseling and testing
- Routine exams including Pap smear
- Contraceptive counseling and education.
- Free condoms are available during business hours.
- Prescriptions or referrals for all contraceptive methods
- Emergency contraception is available seven days a week
- Diagnosis and treatment of Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STDs) and vaginal infections
- Diagnosis and treatment of Premenstrual Syndrome (PMS)
- Treatment or referral for menstrual concerns
- Pregnancy testing
- Counseling options for pregnant patients.
- Referrals for: obstetric services, adoption, and pregnancy termination.
- Colposcopy and biopsy of cervix to follow up on abnormal Pap tests.
- Breast checks and breast self exam instructions

Note: most services are not available during summer break

## In the Event of Sexual Assault

The Women's Clinic is an integral part of the University of Connecticut's sexual assault Crisis Response Team (**CRT**). If a survivor of sexual assault presents within 72 hours, weekdays during clinic hours (during Fall and Spring semesters only) the Women's Clinic can:

- Provide crisis counseling and if the student chooses, have evidence collected such as the rape kit, and blood and urine tests to screen for rape drugs. All care to victims is free, including nursing care, kit collection, antibiotics and Emergency Contraception.
- After hours and weekends, victims are encouraged to call the local sexual assault crisis hotline, (456-2798) and seek care at the local hospital. Most medication prescribed at the hospital can be obtained free of charge at Student Health Services. Arrangements for free transportation to the hospital emergency room can be made by calling 486-4700.
- If a patient decides against evidence collection, a free clinical examination is available, free STD testing, medication to prevent STDs and pregnancy, and referrals to other campus resources.
- All services are available even if the 72 hour time period after the assault has passed
