Wash your hands often with soap and water

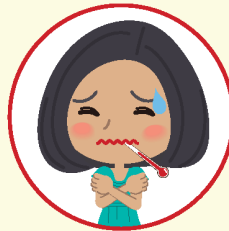


Clean and disinfect surfaces

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF MUMPS



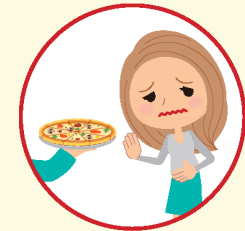
Mumps is best known for the puffy cheeks and swollen jaw that it causes.



Fever



Headache



Loss of appetite



Muscle aches



Tiredness

THERE ARE NO MEDICATIONS TO TREAT MUMPS. PEOPLE WHO SHOW SYMPTOMS USUALLY RECOVER AFTER A WEEK OR TWO, BUT MUMPS CAN OCCASIONALLY CAUSE SERIOUS COMPLICATIONS.
